The 36. Sermon ypon the fourth Chapter.

16 Take heede unto thy selfe, and unto learning: continue in these thinges: for in so doing thou shalt saue thy selfe, and them that heure thee.



Lthough S. Paule had fufficietly warned Timothie before, to take so good

Churche of God with good doctrine, that he should give good example by his life also, yet he confirmeth this matter againe, not only in respect of the man to whome he ipake, but he hath giuen a doctrine that must remaine for ever. And therefore this is a general rule which S.Paul gineth to all shepherds, to wit, that first 20 not this spoken in vain to the Miof al they take heede to theselues, to walke holily as touching their owne persons, and then to take heedealfo to their flocke which is comitted vnto them, that they gine them foder. So then here are two thinges requifite in vs that haue charge to gouern § Church of GOD, we must beware we walke in fuch fort, that our life be 30 the end they may instruct the ignot offenfiue, or give any euill example: and then because honestie sufficeth not in him that must haue his mouth ope, doctrine also must go therwithal. Whatsoeuer he be that will be taken and accompted for a christian, must take heede to him felfe, as Mofes also giueth warning to all the people. And therefore it is saide that the 40 that all shalbe codemned before law of God must guide vs, to the end we should take heede to our

felues. But that that Saint Paule addeth in the fecond place,is fpe≠ cially for § ministers which haue a publique charge: for God hath heede to edifie the 10 not chosen them in vaine to this office. And they are precifely exborted to take heed to thefelues. For although euerie Christian ought to be wife in gouerning his life, and verie watchful, that Satan take him not at ynwares with his tentations,& must also take heed, and preuent al dangers that compasse vs in on euerie side, yet is nifters of the worde : for they are as a candlesticke set vpon a cupboorde or table, they must give light a farre off. It is truely fayde to all Christians in generall, because they beare the light of life, when God hath lightened them with his word, y they must giue good exaple, & walkewifely, to \$ norat. But if this be required in all men without exceptio, what shal we fay of the whome God hath appointed to shew the way to all the rest? So then, there is a great deale leffe excule in v shepherds, that must preache the worde of God, if they walk e disorder ously, then in private men. Trueth it is God, but the vengeaunce shalbe

> double vpon our heads, when we Ec.

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haue no regard to the office, y god hath called vs vnto, and y vpó this condition, that our life shold be as it were a witnes of the doctrine to giue it more authoritie. And therfore we ought to muse well ypon this leffon & warning: if we do but only go vp into y pulpit to preach though we had the best grace that a man could wish for, it is nothing, 10 it is no better then the found e of a brasse pan, Truth it is that it may be heard farre off, it may well beat mens earcs: as a bell y hath a good pleasaunt sound. Such shal we be, if we have good doctrine in our. mouthes,& our liues be wicked & naught. And therfore we must remember this lesson the better, to wit, that it is not inough for vs to 20 betweene states and offices. haue preached the worde of God. purely,& expouded y holy scripture faithfully, & applied y that we haue handled to the peoples yie: our life must speake as well as our toungs, and we must endeuour to walke vprightly, to the end that other may follow vs. It is faid of all beloeuers y they must drawe their neighbours to god in such forte, y 30 ted to gouerne the Church of they must go with the for see how the prophet Efay speaketh Let vs go vp to the Lords mountaine. But (as I faid) we that are ministers of the word of God are more straitly enioyned. And therefore wee must take fo much the more heede that our lives may be so ruled, that we may effectually witnes, y it is not in vaine y God hath chosen vs, & 40 hath. They will bring boldly yso defire to shew all the world the way to daluation, v we go before them, & labour to drawe as neere

to God as wee can. This is one point : but Saint Paule meaneth not, y onely the ministers should give them felues to honefly, he will haue all men to doe fo:but he requireth more ouer of them, that they give heede to doctrine. And therefore, though wee have liued without reproch, though we have beene as looking glaffes formen to beholde all honestic. and the feare of God in, and allvertue, yet are we not quit nor absolued for all that: for GOD hath appointed vs to preach his. worde. Therefore woe bee to vs if we be idle in this behalfe for fo also Saint Paule speaketh. And therfore let vs make a difference

Trueth it is that all Christians are bounde to edifie their neighbours, as God hath ginen them meanes: but yet God hath cipecially given vs the charge to speake in his name. And therfore must our mouthes be alwayes open. Nowe if this marke bee giuen to all them which are apoin-God, we must needes conclude that they that give the people no instruction, can neither call them felues prelates, nor Bulhops, nor Elders, nor Pastours, nor Miniflers: al they that are domb dogs vsurpe those titles falsely. And therefore wee fee what kinde of gouernement the popish church nough that their bishops are the Apostles successors, & that they represent the heavenly principadities:

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lities: but yet what doctrine can we get by them? Hardly may they give that they have not: yea they thinke their Bishoplike dignitie is disgraced, if they go vp into a pulpit to preache. And yet with open mouthes, wil they call them felues Prelates of the Church. Yea wis: but see here the holie Ghost denieth them to 10 be any. We neede not to striue much to difgrade them of those titles, which they take falfly to themfelues : for they are proued lyers by S. Paule, who pronounceth in the authoritic of God, that they that take not heede to doctrine, must not be taken for Pastours. This is it, we have first of all to note vpon this place, to 20 for three days, or for a litle time, wit, that al they whom God hath fet to preache his word, must as touchinge their owne persons walk holily to give good example to all the people, and must aboue all other take heed to thefelues, because God hath called them in the first place, and in an high flep to come to him: and therewithall, that they must give of necessarie: for we see what faintthemselves to doctrine. And to the end that this might be the better obserued. Saint Paule addeth, that Timothie, and all they that are of his calling mu(t continue therein. And therefore, it is not inough for a man to labour to doe well, vnlesse he continue to the end: it is not inough for a man to teache by 40 on our partes so weake, that the puffes, but he must frame himself neuer to bee wearie in taking paines to edifie the Church of

God. As we may see some, y somtime haue a good fign of a zeale, butit waxeth cold verie quickly: for there is no constancie in the. there is no continuall threde. Therfore S.Paul sheweth that he y is called to govern the church, must neuer be wearie, whether it be ingiuing good exaple by his life, or by preaching the word of God, to give foode of faluation continually to the flocke. Therefore we must continue in it, for the word y S.Paul vieth, importeth as much as to Itay & arreit our selues vpo it. To be short, he meaneth, that God, when he calleth a man to be a minister of his word, doth not take him to hyre but will y he give himfelfe wholy to his feruice. Is it fo? then we must not be idle, nor negligent, but follow the order y God hath fhewed vs:& when we haue take paines one yeare or two, let vs know, y this is nothing if we continue not constantly vnto y end. And this warning is more then nes there is in vs . And on the other fide we trie but too much, Sathan goth about as much as he can to bring them out offrame, y are couragious, & to break their hearts, to the end they may faile in the mids of their way. Though the charge we have were not in harde and burdentome, we are least thing in the world wilmake ys leaue off, and turn their pride. And though the difficulties be

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great, yet doeth the diuell turmoyle and toffe vp and downe, as much as he can, to put vs beside the way.

How then can we be constant to quit our selves towarde God and the Churche, vnleffe this lefson be wel imprinted in our harts and memories, to wit, that God hath boud vs to him in fuch fort, 10 and them that he are thee, There is v we must fully & wholy cleaue to him: and take no occasion to be weary, whatfoeuer come of it, but go on flill, vntill we come to our marke. This is it we have to mark in this place. But though S. Paule direct his words especially to them that haue charge to gouerne & Church of God, yet must we take a generall exhortatió out 20 and giue them felues ouer to Saof it, to stay our felues, and stand to that that our Lord sheweth vs, confidering the lightnes & vncőstancie y is in vs al. There is none of vs but feeleth how light we are and then what lacketh daily, but that we be caried away by Satan, To that euerie minute of an houre we forget both God, and our faluation, were it not y we did eue- 30 whole Church, saith he, is put inrie one stir vp our selues? For this cause lot vs marke v S. Paul speaketh not only to one man alone, or to one state, but his minde was to warne all the faithfull as well, that they shall never holde themselves fast to the service of God, vnlesse they confirme themselues in continuance, in despite of Sahe is able to moue against them. And therfore they must never be

wearie: for this is the end of the exhortation that S. Paule fetteth downe here. Moreover he sheweth Timothie the profit that shal come by the zeale and steadines, if he continue to do well,& turne not the bridle, though he must refift many tentations: for, faith he, In so doing, thou shalt saue thy selfe, not one of vs all but defireth to be faued, yeathe worst that are will fay fo:& though their hearts be not touched with it, yet are they moued with a certeine affection, to be faued: but to take the way to it, they cannot abide that: for they despite God, as it were of fet and purposed malice, tan to their destruction: and yet we see that all men have this affection imprinted in their hearts, that they defire to be faued. But S.Paul sheweth here to Timothy, that it is his faluation to walke as he exhorteth him to doe.And afterward he bringeth him a greater reason. For the saluation of § to thine handes. See God hath committed all his flock to the, to be governed:if thou do thy dutie faithfully, thou shalt saue al them that heare thee: but if thou be negligent, & thy life a stumbling blocke, or if thou make no great account to preach the worde of God, all will come to naught, tan his beard, & all the troubles 40 thou shalt see anhorrible confufion before thy face. And therefore sceing GOD hath made thee thee a Minister to faue soules, thou must imploye thy selfe so much the more mightily, & with greater zeale and earneitneile. And this is Saint Paules meaning in fewe wordes. But a man might af ke a question heere, how a man may faue himfelfe: for we knowe **v** this honor is referued to God, (as in deede he deserueth it) for 10 him to be called our fautour: and that we hold our faluation of him. to doe him homage, and give all the praise to him. If euerie one of vs do saue him selfe, what remaineth to God then? For it seemeth that Saint Paule doeth lift men to high here, when he giveth them this charge & office to faue them selues.

But the holie scripture vseth this kinde of speache, when it exhorteth vs to follow our vocation whereunto God hath called vs : and this diminisheth no parte of that that belongeth to GOD, neither leffeneth his honor at all. the least iote that may be. fo God hath this title proper to himselfe to be a Sauiour, as he is well worthie. And why? for euen 30 as he made vs, so he facioneth vs a new to his image, to imprint the marke of his adoption in vs, , to the end we may be his children & heires. We are of nature strangers to God, we are veterly cast away and condemned. But he pitying our milerie, and beeing not willing that we should perishe, 40 draweth vs vnto him: for,because he is the founteine of life, when

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hee calleth vs to him, our life standeth therein. And how so? Whé he lightneth vs by his word & by his holie Ghoft, & frameth our hearts a newe, to the end that we may serue him in all purenes, and when he giveth vs vertue & strength to continue, & holdeth vs by the hand to fight with vs against Sathan, and against all affaultes that are made against vs. We see therfore y al our saluation commeth from God: he beginneth it, he cotinueth it, he brin geth it to perfection: a man may ascribe nothing to himselfe herein, no not fo much as one drop. But because God vseth vs, and maketh vs as it were hisinstrumentes, that is yelded and given to vs in name which is proper to him in deede, as it is faid, that the ministers of the worde are Gods. helpers. But how are they helpers? To edifie and builde vp the Church. And yet is this left him inholie writ, that as it is he that hath laide the foundation of his Church, so doth it belong to him to mainteine it and keepe it, and bring it to perfection. How is this giuen to a mortall man? Though we be unprofitable, yet it pleafeth God to fet vs on worke in his worke.

As he doeth vs this honour, although wee are vnworthye he fhould vie vs in so noble and excellent a worke, as the faluation of men is, so also in this so honourable a title, he parteth stake with vs, and calleth vs his fellow Ee.iij. hel-

helpers. Euen fo standeth the case in enery particular mans saluation. For whe God guideth & gouerneth vs by his holy spirite, & willeth vs to worke our owner faluation, (not that it lieth in our handes, or proceedeth from any vertue or industrie of ours, but because God worketh in vs in fuch fort that we be not as flones 10 or flockes of woode)he sheweth ys his good wil,he breedeth faith) in vs, he giveth vs all the graces of the holy Ghost: and when we haue all this in vs we may call it ours. Euen as we call the break which we cate, ours, although it be given vs of God his meere bountifulnesse and goodnesse: emen to fareth it with the giftes of 20 there is no fuch thing in question. the holic Ghoste. And therefore S.Paule in the epiffle to the Philippians exhorteth the faithfull Phil. 2-12. to worke their owne faluation : but hee addeth that it must be with all feare, knowing that it is God that worketh and giveth vs: the good wil, and the doing, yea, and what elle focuer, through his meere mercie. And therefore fee- 03 in the Papifles abuse themselues, ingit is so that God beginneth & bringeth to end in vs that, that we holde of him, and feeing the good will, and the ablenesse to do good commeth wholy of the holy Ghost, and seeing that the whole must be yeelded to his mere grace, there is good reason we should walke in scare, bowing downe our eyes, voide of all 40 man. Yea wis, but the holy Scripprefumption that puffeth vs. But because wee are Gods instru-

mentes, because he powreth out his vertues vpon vs, we must imploy our felues in that wherevnto he hath called vs, and beware we be not idle. And therefore let vs walke in that calling wherevoto God hath called vs. and then shal we worke our faluation.But how shall we do it? God will doe it in fuch fort that we shalbe his instruments. And therefore we may not thinke it strange that Saint Paul saith here to Timothie, that if he line holily, and do his duetie, he shall saue himselfe. For Saint Paule doeth not dispute here ypon the cause of our faluatio, neither to whom the prayle of it is to be yeelded, here: but that a man should imploy him felfe, yet knowing this that he can do nothing, neither is any thing of himselfe, and therefore that he fuffer God to gouerne him, and know y he deferued not the grace y is don him, and yet that he must walke according to his calling. And herethat beeing fore possessed with this hellishe fantasie, that man hath his free will, & can do fome thing of himfelfe: as soone as Ithey finde any word or fyllable in holy writ, where man is spokentoo, to doe, they conclude therevpon, that there is some might & power, and ableneffe in ture sheweth vs, what our ducty is, and doth not puffe vs vp with pride

pride, as who wold say we might haue some false presumption of our vertues: but it teacheth vs onely that we must not flatter our selues in our slouthfulnesse, nor be as dead (łocks when God quickeneth vs.

Moreover it sheweth vs, from whence wee must receive that that we have not. Now we are to a care to give good example by void of all goodnes, there is not fo much as one drop in vs: therfore we must receiue it froaboue. And therfore let vs marke wel, S. Paules meaning was not, to give any occasion of pride, to the end they should esteeme themselues, but only meant to thew them, y God will yfe them, and apply vs to that service wherevnto hee 20 hath appointed vs : that everie one of vs must suffer him selfe to be guided and gouerned of God as he shall thinke good, and that we play not the stubburne colts, but learne to Jubmit our selues to him, what foe uer become of it. This is one point. As for the lecond, Saint Paule when he saith to Timothie, That he shall saue 02 bimselse, and them that heare him, sheweth what a mater of weight it is to preache the Gospell of GOD. It is to edifie a whole Churche to faluation: or to destroyit, and bring it to damnation. And if this were wel knowen, we for our parts would be more watchfull to walke vprightly, & striue with ourselues to serue the 40 to make vs all fall into everlas-Church well: and all the people also would better consider what

a pleasure God doeth them, whe he lendeth them faithfull paltours, & would make better accompt of them, then they doe. And this is it in fewe words that is conteined in this place: that if there be a good teacher that doeth his duetie throughly in preaching the word of God, and hath his life, that he is as it were a minister of faluation, that G O D hathplaced him to call a whole flocke to faluation. And on the contrarie side, if a man be negligent in teaching, and be as the most part are, and haue no zeale, and for his life, is a naughtie and wicked liver, and as it were a deadly plague amongest men, whē we heare this, know we first of all, that God curleth vs, that it is a figue of his vengeance, when we have not good Pastours, but want men that should preache the doctrine of saluation, and have such as passe not whiche way the world goeth. Therfore if we have men that corrupt and fallifie good doctrine, or elfe be of a wicked and flaunderous life,it is as much, as if God spake from heaven to tell vs , that he withdraweth him selfe from vs. and that we are not worthy to betaught of him, nor to be gouerned by him: and we have not onely this witnesse, but the gate of hell is as it were open ting deltruction. This is it we haue to marke first of all. But E.iiij.

how many are there that thinke vpon this? Nay on the contrarie side, there are a great number, ỳ would gladly haue nothing but idols, to make a shew in a pulpit, and a florishe, as for the rest, the worde of God should be shut vp in a coffer, as the Papiftes keepe their relikes. We see a great number y wold dallie thus with God, 10 and are angry when they fee men haue any zeale to preach § word of God purely, & to amend fuch thinges as are amisse, and to correct faultes. What shall a man say of them, but that they have conspired with Sathan, to put out the grace of God veterly, to the end they may goe headlong into de-Bruction? For they finne not by 20 ignorance: that that Saint Paule faith here is not darke, if they beleene in God, and beleeue that the holie Scripture is his worde. Whereof we have good occasion to dout as touching them, feeing there is so great and horrible wickednesse now a dayes, that they that will call themselves Christians with open mouth, do fo ville- 30 noully mock at God & his word, that they are not worthie to be compared to Turks and Heathen men, but are dogges and fwine, that despite God openly before all the world, and shew it plainly by their deeds. But if they believe that this which S. Paule speaketh here came from the holie Ghost, they shall neede no glose as they may in hard places: for he sheweth, that when there is a teacher

that doeth not his dutie, the gulfe of hell is open, & God displayerh his curse ouer a whole people. On the contrarie side, let vs marke wel, y if y word of God bepreached faithfully vnto vs, and they y preache it, labour also to edifie vs with their good life, we have faluation therein. And we may not thinke this strange, seeing S. Paule calleth the Gospell the almightic power of God to faluation,to all that beleeue.But what? there are verie fewe, that have a defire to apply this vertue to thefelues. In deed they will fay, they desire to be saued, but yet they tread GOD his doctrine under their feete, they could find in their heartes that there were no order of a Church at all, but that it were cleane banished, they shew them felues as open enemies as the Papistes do, or rather more. This is well knowen, and yet would they be taken for great Christians. Yea wis, but then must they builde & make a newe fefus Christ: for we fee that God would have vs fail ten our faluation of our foules, as it were to the word v is preached to vs in his Name, & in his authoritie. And I would to God fuch maner of men had fuch fhepherds as they could wishe, & y it might be to their faluation. I would be farre off of Geneua, & I would to God I might neuer come within two hundreth miles, to dothem good, so y they had men y sought for their faluation.But what?they would have divels. If fuch maner

people were angrie, that our life were naught, that we were too negligent in preaching, and confirming y good doctrine, by good example and good convertation, it were well wee had therein to acknowledg our fault & lewdneffe, & confesse with shame that we have walked amisse. But what? There is question of nothing, but 10 of spewing out their poyson against vs , bycause we delire, (be our weakenesse neuer so much,& though we are farre off in doing our duetie as we ought) to haue God ferued and honoured, and that men render him that honour and authoritie he deferueth and is due to him. But yet men wil fay, wee will doe this and that , Yet 20 rishe . Nowe seeing it pleased when all is done, and we have cast our cards, when they have prated and pratled of rule, and principalitie, and of what foeuer the wicked lay for them felues, as much as they can, yet we see that the marke they shoot at is, that there may bee no order nor policie amongest vs, that there may be no God, y men may mocke & scoffe at it, as they lift. This is the controuersie amongest vs at this day, and y hath ben toffed too and fro a great whyle: and beaftly filthinesse groweth so fast on that ther is no talke of diffembling and cloking it, both earely and late mens mouthes are full of it: for the vilanie is too great . And when it 40 is knowen a far off, & yet there is no talke of it at home in our hou-

fes, or at left wife, we make a fhew as though we faw it not, shall we then I pray you bee well worthie to be condemned? Therefore to come to Saine Paules purpose, or rather to continue it, let vs marke what is faide here: to wit, if wee defire to bee faued by gods hand, we must seeke our saluatio in the doctrine which is preached vnto ys in his name.

If we malice and dispite at men, it will cost vs dere . For they that are melancholy and froward, that will neither eate nor drinke, who hurre they or wrong they ? Euen so let vs be spitefull against God his word, for the hatred we beare to men, and wee shall furely pe-God to fende to vs, and feeing he will have vs to bee instructed at there mouthes, and that they shal be our guydes to shew vs our faluation, let vs beware we prouoke not God to anger by wittingly casting his grace awaye from vs. This is it we have to beare away. And therefore seeing God offereverence thewed to the word of 03 reth vs fuch an helpe to faluation, as to have his worde preached to vs , and that wee shoulde be edefied by good example; , let vs fee y we make our profit of fuch a treafure: for otherwise our vnthankfulnesse shall not be excusable. Nowebycause all that call themfelues Christians are not so, Saint Paule faith, that Timothie feall feus them that heare him, giving vs to undestande, that there shall bee no fault but in themselves whome

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God calleth by his word, if they. be not brought to the way of faluation when they have a faithful The pherde to guide the. But wee ar far fró being al fuch hearers as S.Paule requireth here. Truth it is that fome will come to church when they thinke good, yea and that to shewe, that they wil haue liberty to do what they lift, & be 10 subject to no order nor pollicie, So that they come hither(as you wold fay)to fay this:fe, here I am: but yet I wil come whé it plefeth me, for as for me, I am not of the common forte. So that there are some that remaine thus beastly, that whereas they should profit, they will do nothing but fleepe. There are other that will not bee so beastly, and ye shall see some honestie in them, they wil not be impudent and past shame to dispite God, and tread the order of his Church under their feete, but yet their cares are verie long, fay to thể what you will, it is all one. Some fleep, other fome are as ful of poylon, as todes, and can abid no doctrine, vnlesse they knowe before what shall be taught the: 30 othersome come to spie what we fay, as the prophete precifely casteth in the wickeds teeth, and vpbradeth v houshold enimies of the Church of God, that they lay wayt for the that fpeake, and ieke to trape thë in their words: & if they can get one word vantage against the, then make they 40 great noise. Ho, this may not be fuffred, weemust take order for

this. And thus a great number of them that call them felues Christians shew plainly that they are not of that forte of those hearers that Saint Paule meaneth in this place. And why fo? For S. Paule speaketh not here of them that heare, as if a man should loke vpon his face in a glaffe, (for fo S. Jam. 1. 25.) James vieth this funilitude) bur he speaketh of them that receive the doctrine quietly, and shewe thefelues teachable not for one day, but cotinue to profit in god his schoole. And therefore when we give fuch an eare to God, § wee are content to be taught by him, and thew that defire, not for a finall feafon, but as long as wee liue, then shall we be taken for Gods scholers, and good hearers of his worde and shall be partakers of faluation that is offred vs there but if in steed of hearing, some stope their eares, other be as drunkardes, other fluggishe and fleepie, other doe but make a least at it, we cannot bring such men to faluation. For what can we doe, seeing they resiste God? And therefore the Gospel which of it owne nature should be a sauour of life, is by this meanes turned to death. So that wee fee hereby howe wicked men are. God caufeth his funne to fhinne vppon vs, and we take occasion to be more blinde. God fendeth vs his word,to make ys walke in his obediéce, & it hardeneth vs more & more.Therefore whe we do in such wise preuent God his

purpose is there not a misshieuous and curfed rebellion in vs? To be shorte we turne light into darkenesse, life into death, bread into poylon, this we doe. But after that Saint Paul hath faid that the Gospell through the malice ofmen, is a fauour of death, he addeth notwithstanding, that it is a sweete sauour of God : and 10 we have sought their saluation addeth this precisely, to the end we should take good heartes to vs when wee see the vnthankefulnes of men, and that wee can not bring them to faluation, as it were to be wished, yet must we not leave off to employ our felues and take paines therin. Therfore if we fee men goe about to cast away themselves, and refuse the grace that is offred them, by our meanes, let vs still go on, but it shall be to them condemnation that wee preach. And though the doctrine that commeth out of our mouthes is a fauour of death to them, and condemneth them, yet is it a good and fweete fauour to God (aith S.Paule.He accepteth our feruice. This is it we haue to note,& make an end of this place, to wit, that the minillers of the word of God, mult directe them felues to all, both finall and great, they must have this defire to edificall the world: but if there are deafe men that can not heare them, if there bee wicked men that refuse to heare them, if there bee scoffers that bring al to confusion, what must they do? Let them go on itil, and

call as many to God as they can, as it is faid in the Prophet Efay. See I am here, and the children Efa. at 12 which thou hast given me. Therfore we must take pains to draw all the world to faluation, if ther be any wilde coltes and fauage beaftes, that withdraw themselues from the flocke, well, so that as much as we could, let vs go on further, knowing that this fauor of death shall notwithstanding, be a sweet sauour to God,& acceptable to him: let vs fay with the prophet Efay. Lord beholde here:I am, & the children which thou hast giuć me: knowing that God must give his sone the that 20 are his, & that his fon must feede vs, to the end that he may be the cheefe Shepherd. And this is it, we haue to beare away. Moreouer, euerie one of vs muste make his profit of this doctrine, & efpecially we must not be offeded, whe we le lauage people,&horn mad beafts, that will in no wife frame them sclues to God, nor 30 haue a quiet and well natured mind, to obey true doctrin. Ther fore whe we fe fuch wild beafts v do nothing els but wast & sow discord & discentió in y Church let vs not be disquieted & offeded, notwithstading their attents & practifes, but feing y divel goeth about by y meanes, to break our harts, & to discourage vs, let vs not cease for al y, to go on still cotinually to preach this doctrin which is y mighty power of god for

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for our faluation, and feeing wee have once entred into this race, let ys continue in it, all the dayes
